Day trip to Segovia

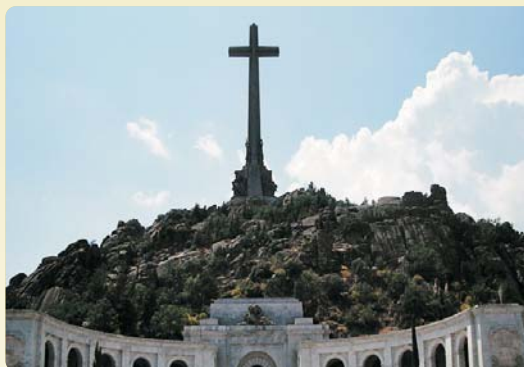
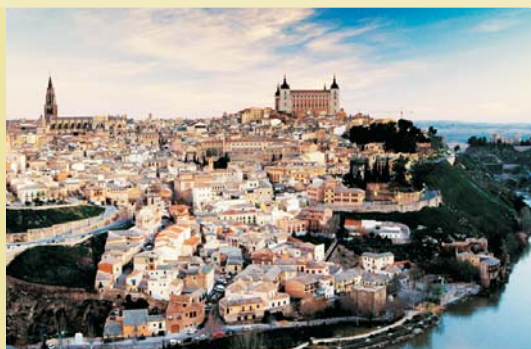
Segovia is one of the various must-do day trips while in Madrid. Visit this World Heritage site, famous for its Roman aqueduct that stands tall in the center of the old quarter. In addition, you will see numerous Romanesque churches, the Cathedral and the Fortress (castle).

Day trip to Toledo

Toledo is a World Heritage site located just outside of Madrid. It is known as the “city of the three cultures” because Christians, Arabs and Jews lived together in this city for centuries. Behind its walls, Toledo preserves an artistic and cultural legacy in the form of churches, palaces, fortresses, mosques and synagogues



Day trip to Day Trip to El Escorial and El Valle de los Caídos Saturday, September 12 (9:00 am)

Visit two emblematic architectural monuments located within the province of Madrid. The monastery of El Escorial, located in a picturesque area with beautiful views of Spanish landscape, was built by King Philip II and is the site where many of Spain’s past monarchs are buried.

Afterwards, visit the controversial Valle de los Caídos, a monastery built in a mountain which is where former Spanish dictator Francisco Franco as well as José Antonio Primo de Rivera are buried.

Day trip through the Sierra de Madrid

Day trip to Salamanca

Salamanca has been declared “City of Mankind’s Heritage” by UNESCO, and is best known for its university founded in the beginning of the 13th century. 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Visit to the Prado Museum

A premier world-class museum, the Prado museum has one of the finest collections of Spanish paintings. Its permanent collection houses the works of Francisco Goya, Diego Velázquez and El Greco, among others. Price includes entrance fees and guided visit in English.
